YEAR 7 TRANSITION

We are very fortunate to work in some of the most beautiful countryside in England. We work closely with our partner primary schools to ensure that transition to Callington Community College is as smooth as possible.

The move to Callington Community College starts well before the summer when our staff visit every primary school to talk to our primary partners and get to know each student as an individual. We hold a variety of transition events, including opportunities for every new Year 7 student to spend at least one whole day in school during July, to meet key staff and other students. Some of our most vulnerable students participate in our enhanced transition programme. The morning of the first day in September is just for Year 7, so they feel confident before the rest of the school joins them. All of our Year 7 tutor groups have two dedicated Peer Mentors from Year 11 assigned to them to work with and support the new students.

There are also a wide variety of clubs and activities for Year 7 students to engage in throughout their first year. It is important to us that your child feels safe and secure all day long, so our pastoral teams are highly visible and proactive, resulting in consistently calm and positive behaviour for learning.




PARTNERSHIPS FOR LEARNING

We have forged strong links with local Further Education providers to enable effective progression post 16. Those students who stay on at Callington Community College achieve some of the highest results in Cornwall. Our Sixth Form provision is highly regarded and provides an excellent bridge between school and university. We are committed to creating a caring and well-ordered environment where mutual respect is present in all interactions. We want to help children to find and nurture their talent and to understand themselves and others. By doing so we will enable students to think for themselves and make informed judgments. We will encourage children to develop their personal, moral, social and cultural awareness and to live out their values in their lives.

To enable our Sixth Form students to reach their full potential, we offer a wide range of A Level courses, as well as some BTEC Level 3 courses. Teaching at post-16 is a real strength and subjects are well resourced. Naturally this leads to great results and high aspirations for our students. There is a wide range of enrichment opportunities in which our students are encouraged to participate, such as mentoring younger students, work experience and taking on volunteering roles within the local community. Our advice and guidance, coupled with excellent links to employers and universities, ensures that our Sixth Form leavers have the best possible futures ahead of them, regardless of



whether their next steps are into the work place or into higher education. Callington Community College has a fine record of Oxbridge, Russell Group and Higher Education entry. For those that choose to go into the world of work, students have recently gained apprenticeships or pursued careers in the services. Students benefit from excellent personal support from the Sixth Form Team. We have a continuous open door policy so that students can talk to a member of the Sixth Form team at any time. Help is always available - no problem is too big or small!



OUTSTANDING OPPORTUNITIES

Callington Community College is a vibrant community of learners where individuality and creativity is truly valued and celebrated. We provide all students not just with excellent academic teaching, but with a well-rounded educational experience filled with memorable extra-curricular experiences which give our students a chance to shine.

We welcome, however, initial enquiries from parents/carers who may wish to have an informed look around or discussion with a College representative. Please call the College to make an appointment.






OUR SCHOOL CURRICULUM
