Latin	What will you learn:	A Level Latin builds on the GCSE, introducing students to a greater range of vocabulary, accidence and syntax. This requires the detailed study of prose and verse literature, inspiring and motivating learners to gain a deeper understanding of the life and culture of the ancient world. The study of Latin develops critical thinking and logical analysis.
10 J ST P J J		Students acquire the language skills which enable them to read literary texts, both prose and verse, in the original language as well as develop an interest in, and enthusiasm for, the literary, historical and cultural features of the ancient world. In addition students make an informed personal response to the material studied and begin to develop a sensitive and analytical approach to the language generally.
ERIM PELADIATOR	Elements of the course:	Students must complete all components (1, 2, 3 and 4) to be awarded the OCR A Level in Latin. Familiarity with, and understanding of, the vocabulary, grammar and syntax from the GCSE syllabus are vital for successful study at this higher level.
