

G7 Comes to Callington!

For those who live, work and go to school in Cornwall it has been almost impossible not to notice the presence of the G7 Summit in our beautiful county. From the extra police positioned at either end of the Tamar Bridge, Air Force One flying directly over South East Cornwall, to news coverage of special G7 pasties, G7 protests and a ring of steel surrounding Carbis Bay, G7 has had an

impact almost everywhere. Most importantly, the presence of G7 in Cornwall has opened up an important discussion on issues such as climate change, inequality, plastic pollution and Covid recovery. This week has put Cornwall in the spotlight on an international level with the



Throughout the week, there have been a number of activities taking place in college to mark this event. One such event has been the G7 Mock Summit held in school. **Matthew** (year 8) reports:

"Now some of you may be wondering whether the G7 Summit happened in our school. Well, it kind of did! We didn't have international presidents and prime ministers at our school, instead our school hosted a mock G7 summit. This happened in room E10 with four countries: France, Japan, UK and USA. Each country proposed a policy for the topics of discussion: Plastic pollution and CO2 emissions. The United Kingdom proposed twenty-four-hour policing for marine protected areas as part of the 30 by 30 initiative; France proposed a policy where people change their old cars to more affordable, more economical cars and to

improve public transport systems; Japan proposed running a trial of a money for plastic system. This system is used in Greece and worked wonders but would require a large budget.

At the end of the mock summit, each delegate was given a

vote and I can announce the policy being brought into place is Money for Plastic in the fishing industry as proposed by Japan. This policy means that the fishing industry will collect plastic and hand it in to local officials for money up to £300. This policy would have been trialled in Japan and if successful would be moved worldwide."

The students who took part in the G7 summit were absolutely amazing. They spoke with passion and with a deep understanding of the importance of looking after our future.

KNOW YOUR ABCs

Athletes need to interpret challenges positively in order to overcome them. They can do this by learning their ABCs: recognize Activating events, challenge unhelpful Beliefs, and fight against negative Consequences.
