

### <u>Media Studies Sixth Form Trip to Warner Bros.</u> <u>Studio Tour</u>

After an early start on Friday 18<sup>th</sup> March, 22 sixth form students, Mrs Kirby and Miss Smyth set off on their journey to London to visit the Warner Bros. Studio Tour in London.

The students were in good spirits, with a mix of some extreme Harry Potter fans and some who had never even seen the films or read the books. We arrived after four and a half hours and set off into the very large studio. The excitement was building, especially after being told that two upcoming films were being filmed right next door to where we were.

When we entered the building, we were given some background information about the filming of Harry Potter before we entered the main room and were taken for our workshop on costume and careers in films. The students were exceptional and worked together in groups to analyse some materials given to them by the staff at the studio. A lively discussion on careers within the media industry was had, and after an hour, we were free to set off on the tour of the studio. With the hall being still set up for Dolores Umbridge's O.W.L examinations, there was so much to see, including how they made the screaming letters called howlers within the films.

The students learned a lot, with one student stating it was a "really good experience, [I] had such an AMAZING time" and we even managed to convert the non-Harry Potter fans in the group! The students really enjoyed seeing how the castle, a miniature model version, was actually used in the film for all of the wide castle shots and the different aspects of the tour itself, such as the real costumes used and the green screen for the broomstick shots.

Overall, the trip was a huge success and we were able to follow up on the trip with our lessons when we returned to the college. A massive well done to the students who were fantastic ambassadors for the college from start to finish.





# Media, Film & Photography trip to Paris

After a very early start on Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> March, 23 sixth form students, Mrs Kirby, Mr Aird and Mrs Polhill set off on their journey to Paris on the train from Plymouth.

The students were in good spirits, despite the early hour, and we settled down in our carriage to relax during



the 3-hour train journey to London. On arrival to Paddington Station, we jumped onto the tube and headed to St Pancras station where we waited to go through security for the Eurostar. Excitement was building as many of us had never travelled on the Eurostar before.

The students were brilliant as we went through the rigid security checks and the added procedure of having our Covid passes scanned. Once through, we had some lunch and waited for our boarding time to arrive. After a short wait, we were able to climb aboard the train and we were off! At incredibly high speeds (274 km/h) we whizzed across to France in no time at all. And then we were there! Getting off the train at the Gare du Nord train station in Paris, we were met by Monia, our tour guide, who gave us a hidden gem tour of the real Paris as we walked through the bustling streets to the Hotel de Ville, Notre Dame, along the Seine river and to the Louvre and finally finishing at the Place de la Conchord where our coach was waiting to take us to our hotel at Disneyland. Whilst this was a very tiring end to a long journey, the students were exceptional, and it was wonderful to see the sights on foot. The day ended with a meal at Disney Village and then a good night's sleep.

Day 2 was our day at Disneyland Paris, where the students were tasked with looking at Disney as a

conglomerate and the power that they have over the Media industry. Whilst doing so, they found themselves going upside down, spinning around and being surrounded by some of the happiest people on earth! With their Minnie Mouse ears on the students had a wonderful day, finished off with even some tears over the spectacle of the beautiful illuminations on the Disney castle. A meal at Disney Village and some retail therapy saw the end of this day.

Our final day started with us being picked up by our coach and taken into the heart of Paris to the Eiffel Tower where almost all students took on the challenge of walking up the 674 steps to the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor and then hopped in the lift to the very top. The views were absolutely outstanding and we were so lucky to have a crystal clear blue sky to make the most of the landscape of Paris. When we returned to ground level, we took the Metro train to the Gare du Nord where we had some lunch before boarding the Eurostar and our return journey began. We arrived in London just in time for dinner and our final train brought us back to Plymouth just before midnight.



The students were outstanding throughout all three days – we could not have asked for a better trip for the weather, location, accommodation and travel – and we can't wait for New York next year!
