PLYMOUTH UNIVERSITY

On Thursday, 45 Callington Community College students arrived at Plymouth University to find out more about possible careers and areas of study in the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths. We were joined by students from other colleges across Devon and Cornwall from Year 10.

There were talks on Artificial Intelligence, Humans and Mega faunal Extinctions and Pyromania amongst others. We were lucky enough to be given an insight into the main reasons for megafauna, such as sabre-toothed cats and mammoths, becoming extinct, from one of the University's top Geography lecturers. We also had some insight into Plymouth's climate hundreds of thousands of years ago. And we learnt that we all already use AI on a daily basis and but we need to be careful with the ethics of any future developments.

There was a marquee full of stands from businesses and faculties with loads of hands on activities: tasting seaweed gel, testing our facial recognition skills, driving remotely controlled objects, learning how Googlemaps build their 3D designs, watching a WALL-E-style robot at work, finding out about marine plastic pollution, physics, virtual imaging, chemistry, microbiology...


