understanding of road position and when to signal has improved. Well done to all






Pizzatastic!

Exeter Scholars Programme

Congratulations to Year 12 students Jack Reddiclife and Mia P who have been accepted as part of the Exeter Scholars Programme for the forthcoming academic year. Callington Community College Sixth Form and Exeter University have



developed an official partnership which aims to raise aspirations and increase awareness of higher education. Mia has been accepted as part of the Classics and Ancient History programme and Jack as part of the Physics Programme.

Year 12 student Mia commented 'I am taking part in the Exeter Scholars Classics and Ancient History strand at Exeter University. I attended a conference day and a taster session for this subject on Saturday 1st December,



and felt very impressed with the university as a whole, and surprised myself with how many people I was able to become comfortable with in only two hours! I'm very excited and proud to have been accepted, as it's a brilliant opportunity for those wishing to attend university in the future, and allows you to build on your confidence as a student as well as make new friends and enhance your passion for a subject throughout the process. Personally, I hope that taking part in the Scholars programme will allow me to learn more about Ancient History at degree level, as history is something I'm very passionate about and intend to study at university. Choosing this strand of study has also permitted me to explore an area of history that hasn't been looked at in a lot of depth throughout my GCSE and A Level History courses.

Like many young boys, the dream was always to be a professional footballer and one day pull on the famous England shirt. Despite enjoying a very successful youth football career which involved playing for two professional clubs as a youth player, it was at the age of 17 where those boyhood dreams came to a crashing end. After a weekend at Lilleshall National Sports Centre, where I had attended the final England Schoolboys U18s trial, I received the letter which I hoped I would never receive - I hadn't been selected for the final squad for the forthcoming season. I was lost: distraught, disappointed and devastated, but as I have come to learn, failure is such an important part of success.

After spending some time in America, playing and coaching soccer but also studying, I graduated with a BA (Hons) in Sport Science whilst also completing my FA/UEFA coaching qualifications. Fifteen years ago, an opportunity was given to me to help out with the Cornwall Schools FA under 18 squad as a coach. This voluntary role has led to me being part of the England Schools FA U18s coaching staff. During the last 5 years, I have had the honour and privilege to coach and support some of the best young players in the country, many of whom have gone on to play professional football within the UK and beyond. Last Saturday saw the final England trial held at Stafford Town FC, Staffordshire in which I was given the opportunity to manage the South West England U18s team against the South East and the North. This was an amazing experience and



some of the players on display were outstanding. Six of the SW players, including our first ever Cornish player, have been selected to represent England during the coming season, where they will play against Wales, Scotland, Northern Ireland and Republic of Ireland. Over the next couple of years my aim is to be appointed Assistant Manager and eventually manager of the U18s Schools FA.


