

However, the inevitable happened, and after three blocks on the goal line Ivybridge scored from close range. Chance after chance fell to all of the Callington players; some one on ones missed and great saves now from the Ivybridge keeper. Then in the final minute with the game destined for penalties a long ball from Ben Alford released JJ Brenton through on goal - he ran the length of the pitch, his powerful drive destined for the top corner was somehow saved, the rebound fell to the Ivybridge defender but JJ slid in to poke the ball towards the goal. Time stopped as the ball rolled towards and over the goal line. In the final minute of the game Callington had done it, they had beaten Ivybridge and reached the last 32 in the country.

A trip to Bournemouth on December 4<sup>th</sup> awaits the team.




If you have any library books at home that are overdue, please return them to the public library or place in the box opposite the Key Stage 3 office as soon as possible.
















The work above is from Miss Dunlop's class. She is incredibly proud of everyone's efforts.
