Born to Ski



British Slalom Ski Championship U18 3rd. Callington ski racer, Eva Pascoe secures U18 1st place podium for the GBR Series and 3rd place podium at the British Outdoor Artificial Slalom Ski Championship 2018. Representing Torquay Alpine Ski Club and South Wales based Dragons Alpine Racing, Eva has competed throughout the country in five GBR Series races at Stoke on Trent, Edinburgh, Chatham and two at Pontypool. The GBR Series represents the highest-level competition outside of the National Championships. Having moved up to the U18 category this year, competition has been fierce; with two 1st, two 2nd and one 4th place podiums, Eva has achieved 1st overall in the U18 GBR Series. This has, for the second year in a row, successfully secured her 2nd place overall female in the country. Selected on the basis of her national seeding, Eva has also enjoyed representing Snowsport England as a National Snowsport Ambassador and England squad member throughout this season for the second year in a row.



Returning to the legendary Hillend slope outside of Edinburgh, Eva competed in the British Outdoor Artificial Slalom Ski Championship 2018 on Saturday 22nd September. She raced really well over two runs to secure 3rd place in the U18 category, topping off what has been another highly successful year for the Callington racer.

Eva said, 'I won the British U14 title back in 2015, crashed out in 2016, won the U16 title in 2017 and achieved 3rd this year in the U18 category. I am absolutely delighted to podium again; Hillend is like no other slope in the UK and it demands huge respect. The speeds generated on such a steep slope mean you have to be very focussed; you have to push as hard as you can but there is a very fine line between pushing too hard and skiing out of the course and running too safe a line and reducing your speed. I am really grateful for all the support and encouragement I have had again this year from a number of people here in the South West but also from my coaches in Wales'.

This is amazing news, we are so proud of her. She really is incredible.

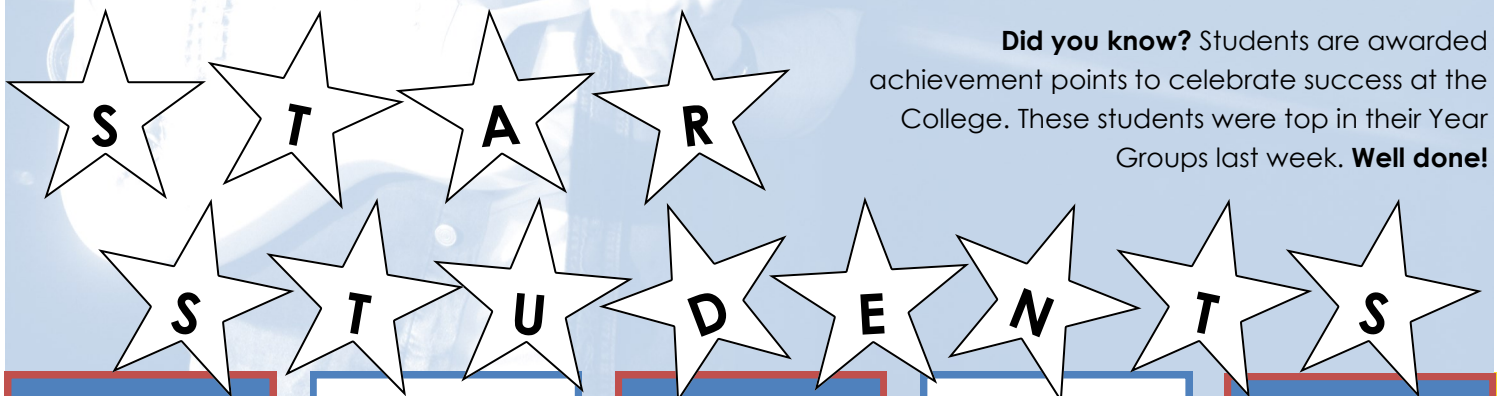

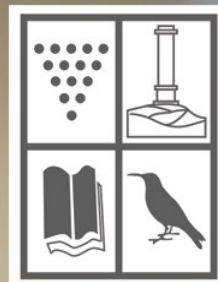
