


Wolf Alice is made up of (L-R) Joel Amey, **Joff Oddie** (former Callington Community College student), Ellie Rowsell and Theo Ellis

Numeracy Ninjas

This week saw the launch of the Numeracy Ninjas initiative

led by Mr B Watts. Numeracy Ninjas is a whole-College numeracy intervention run during Tutor sessions on Wednesdays. In each session students complete a 5-minute skills test which includes: 10 questions on mental numeracy calculation 10 timestables strategies,



questions and 10 questions on key topics that must be mastered before studying GCSE Maths. The tests are marked in class by students who record their Ninja Score out of 30. This corresponds to a particular colour Ninja Belt. Only a Ninja Score of 30 will earn students the coveted Black Ninja Belt!


This little-and-often approach ensures students' improved numeracy skills and fluency are retained a over time.
