attitudes and personal development and welfare. Whilst in Ofsted terms we are a 'requires improvement

'school, what leaps from our report is the care, support and guidance our young people receive and recognition of the significant gains we have made over that last few years. Let's not forget that we had a special measures judgement sitting over us a few weeks ago, entirely for not providing students with the necessary care, guidance and support!

The inspection team fed back to the \sim Governing Body and members of the

Leadership Team after the second full day of inspection and were very clear in their expectation that we would be Good in all areas within 18 months. They commended our curriculum model, defining it as 'exemplary', recognised the work we were doing with teaching staff and our work on mastery – a term used to describe a complete understanding linked to skills and knowledge and commended our new incentives to get all students reading across the College. The

processes to improve SEND provision and the progress of disadvantaged students

were recognised as fledging projects but with real

merit and just needing a little longer to bear fruits. The entire Ofsted process was hugely

rewarding in that it confirmed that we have in place all the right things that will enable our young

people to be highly successful.

We know just how lucky we are to work with the young people in our care and I know that some of the extra-curricular opportunities we offered in the past are missed. We still have an extensive extra -curricular programme, but we are reaffirming what our engagement and enrichment week looks like next year. It will incorporate a community action day and a grand day out which will afford all students with the opportunity to have between one and three days away to some exciting venues. More news on this will follow over the next few weeks.

We are incredibly blessed also to receive a Plymouth Elmer elephant who will reside in our Art Department for two weeks. He has been donated to us by Tesco. Our students will be decorating their own Elmers with poems and images of remembrance. This will be of particular significance as Tesco purchased their Elmer to commemorate a colleague of theirs who sadly passed away at age 22 and prior to this attended Callington Community College. We are hugely grateful to Tesco for affording us this opportunity and we look forward to sharing this work with you.

If you don't see the book on the shelf, write it!


