prepared resources and tools to support online if needed. These will include the use of Show My Homework and Google Classroom to support teacher-student interaction. We remain hopeful that the College will continue to remain open, we will of course update you as soon as more developments occur. We are also mindful of our upcoming ski trip. The government advice has been to cancel all trips abroad. We are currently exploring

this and consulting with our insurance company to

understand the impact of this. We will not be able to make any decisions until we are fully informed as to all outcomes of this, but we will advise as soon as we are able to.

We were recently successful in securing a potential source of funding. RGB Building Supplies, a local company run a project






